Unit observed Keralappiravi Day in a grand manner. Various competitions including Versification, Essay Writing and Elocution were conducted for students and teachers.

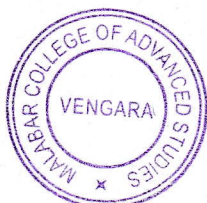
